Now, with excitement building for the WABL State Championships in November and December, we look forward to finishing the year strong and continuing our mission to elevate the game for everyone involved.


NBL1-West

They battled fiercely throughout the season, ultimately finishing just one game short of a Grand Final appearance—a testament to their determination and team spirit. On the other hand, the Men's team, led by Head Coach Damian Barr, faced a challenging season. Despite flashes of brilliance and a committed squad, they were unable to secure a finals berth for the second consecutive year, finishing in 11th place. The team remains focused on rebuilding and is determined to return stronger in 2026. With both head coaches stepping down, the club is now looking ahead to a new chapter, seeking fresh leadership to guide the Hawks into the next era of NBL1 competition.

HAWKS REFEREE PROGRAM



The 2025 season was a remarkable success for the Perry Lakes Hawks Basketball Referee Program. Under the leadership of Referee Coordinator Eddie Farquharson, the program achieved significant growth and development across all areas. Eddie demonstrated exceptional skill in managing referee rostering for our Junior Domestic Competition, Junior Development League, and WABL fixtures, ensuring seamless operations throughout the season.

Beyond his administrative responsibilities, Eddie dedicated considerable time and effort to enhancing the education and professional development of our officials. His unwavering commitment to continuous improvement has been instrumental in elevating the standard of officiating across the program.

This year, the Referee Program successfully delivered two Association Beginner Referee Courses, a Level 1 Referee Course, and a Level 1 Referee Coach Course. These initiatives led to a substantial increase in the number

of qualified referees and referee coaches within the association.

Throughout the season, many officials earned promotions through our referee panel, with numerous referees achieving their Basketball WA Level 1 Accreditation. These accomplishments reflect both the dedication of our officials and the ongoing strength and quality of the Perry Lakes Hawks Basketball Referee Program.

From a total of 157 active referees, 40 officiated in the Junior Development League, 151 in the Junior Domestic Competition, and 49 in WABL fixtures. Our WABL referees particularly distinguished themselves, with 17 officials selected to referee the WABL Finals.

The achievements of this season underscore the growth, professionalism, and excellence of our referee program, and set a strong foundation for continued success in the years ahead.
